
Dear Residents,

Happy New Year from your Mayor and Council! The Township of Ocean just finished celebrating our 175th anniversary with some truly great events throughout the year. These events are not possible without the fantastic staff who are always going above and beyond for this great municipality. As elected officials, we can't be successful without our employees. Thank you!

As a Council, we have made strides in 2024 to move Ocean in the right direction. For starters, we began a five-phase process for stream cleaning to begin to mitigate storm flooding in Ocean. We received a \$250,000 Deal Lake dredging grant and a \$350,000 bridge grant for the spillway over Lollipop Pond thanks to Assemblywomen Donlon and Peterpaul. We have met with the NJDOT to discuss our traffic issues and ideas to alleviate some of the congestion. We hired a planner to study our Rte. 35 Corridor, specifically areas that are blighted and in need of redevelopment. We began discussions on potentially constructing a new municipal hall which is long overdue. We also hired a planner to study five potential locations for the complex. These are just some of the issues we have tackled in the last year.



Since playing golf has become such a popular sport, we opened the Christopher P. Siciliano 10th Hole Golf Center at the William F. Larkin Golf Course in August. The building has 4 golf simulators and a meeting space to hold events. You can play by the hour or join with a monthly membership. The building is a welcome addition to Ocean and gives more options for meeting space. Please contact Mike Butrico, our Recreation Director, for more details. We also want to thank the Women's Club of Asbury Park for planning the successful Mayor's Charitable Golf Tournament at Hollywood G.C. The women raised funds for a new roof at their complex on Wickapecko Drive. They are always looking for more ladies to expand their membership.

Do You Know About?

Property Tax Relief Programs

There are several programs for property tax relief including deductions for veterans, senior citizens, disabled persons, and surviving spouses of the aforementioned individuals. Totally disabled veterans whose disability is related to their military service are eligible for an exemption from property taxation. Information regarding these deductions/exemptions can be obtained through our website, www.oceantwp.org/assessor, or by visiting or calling the Tax Assessor's office at 732-531-5000, ext. 3345 or 3346.

Tax and Sewer Bill information

Tax bills are mailed out once a year in July. Sewer bills are mailed out once a year in January. Added/omitted tax bills for improvements made to your property are mailed in October and are due November 1st. Payments for both tax and sewer can be made in person, by mail or electronically on the Township of Ocean website, www.oceantwp.org. Name and Address Changes

If you require a change to the legal name of the owner or owners of your property, a new deed must be filed with the Monmouth County Clerk's office— https://co.monmouth.nj.us/page.aspx?ID=1985. Once we receive the new deed from the County Clerk's office, our records will be updated to reflect the new owner information.

Since 2011, Township residents have recycled an average of approximately 290 tons of material per month through the Township's single-stream curbside recycling program.

The Township recycling drop-off center is located at 3602 Sunset Avenue, the west end of Sunset Avenue.

HOURS: 7:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Monday through Friday (except holidays) and Saturday 8 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.

Summer Hours – (April 15 through September 30): Monday, Wednesday and Friday 7:30 a.m. - 2:30 p.m., Tuesday and Thursday 7:30 a.m. - 5:00 p.m., Saturday mornings 8:00 a.m. to 12 p.m.

Single-stream recycling of all plastic containers (HDPE 1-7), glass, tin aluminum cans, cardboard, newspaper, magazines, junk mail and shredded paper is available for Township residents and business owners.

Scrap metal and electronics are separated and placed in individual containers. We also accept bulk waste and concrete. The center, however, will not accept these materials from commercial entities.

For purposes of trash, recycling and bulk collection, our Township is broken into four quadrants/zones shown below.



Composting Is Also Recycling

Composting involves placing kitchen vegetables and yard waste into a special (compost) pile, so that it breaks down into a natural, soil-like product which can be used as fertilizer.


Composting bins can be purchased at the Township municipal building located at 399 Monmouth Road.

CONSTRUCTION AND BUILDING

The Construction and Building Department is responsible for enforcing the regulations of the New Jersey Uniform Construction Code as adopted, as well as issuance and inspections for all required construction permits, both residential and commercial.

PLANNING AND ZONING

The Planning and Zoning Divisions are responsible for providing professional services to the Planning Board and Board of Adjustment, reviewing all land use applications and the issuance of zoning permits for driveways, fences, patios and storage containers. Our Zoning Division also reviews and issues business licenses and temporary sign permits.

Environmental Commission and Shade Tree Commission



The mission of the Township of Ocean Environmental Commission is to promote the conservation and preservation of all the natural resources of the Township. The Commission meets monthly, usually on the first Thursday of each month at 8:00 pm.

The Shade Tree Commission promotes the planting and care of the trees and shrubs located along the streets, public places, and parks in the Township. The Commission meets monthly, usually on the first Thursday of each month at 7:00 pm.

SOME BENEFITS OF TREES:


- Landscaping, especially with trees, can significantly increase property values.
- Three trees placed strategically around a single-family home can cut summer air conditioning needs by up to 50 percent. The net cooling effect of a healthy tree is equivalent to 10 room-sized air conditioners operating 20 hours a day. By reducing the energy demand for cooling our houses, we reduce carbon dioxide and other pollution emissions from power plants.
- Leafy tree canopies catch rain before it reaches the ground, allowing some of it to gently drip and the rest to evaporate. This diminishes the impact of storms by reducing runoff and erosion. One large oak tree can absorb and transpire 40,000 gallons of water a year.
- Studies have shown that patients with views of trees out their windows heal faster and with fewer complications. Children with ADHD show fewer symptoms when they have access to nature. Exposure to trees and nature aids concentration by reducing mental fatigue.


In 2023, Shade Tree Commission gave approximately 220 trees to Township residents. Each year, the Environmental Commission gives seedlings to all third graders in Ocean Township schools for Arbor Day. In 2023 that amounted to 350 seedlings.


The Township of Ocean Clean Communities program ensures that litter abatement is performed on all Township properties, including our many parks, and coordinates the cleaning of some of the local,




county and state roadways within the Township. Through public education, community events and partnerships with the schools, our goal is to keep Ocean clean and litter-free.

In Ocean Township, flooding and other drainage problems can result after several inches of rain in a short period of time or after several days of continued rain. In past years, our community has experienced numerous rainfall events causing flood damage. Hurricanes, tropical storms and other threatening weather can present flood hazards to residents especially when there are high tides, storm surges caused by winds, and heavy rainfall.

It is wise to consider the possible flood hazards before you buy any property. Typical homeowners insurance policies exclude coverage for flood damage. Talk to your insurance provider about your policy and consider whether you need additional coverage.

The National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) helps provide a means for property owners to financially protect themselves if additional coverage is required. The NFIP offers flood insurance to homeowners, renters, and business owners if their community participates in the NFIP. To find out how much flood damage could cost you, estimate your premium and learn more about the NFIP visit www.FloodSmart.gov.

"Turn Around, Don't Drown." Floods are among the most frequent natural hazards in New Jersey, and among the most devastating in terms of human hardship and economic loss. During a weather event or a natural disaster, it's important to realize that the best thing to do is to stay home unless instructed otherwise by public officials. If you have to go out, please understand that your car cannot drive through flooded roadways.






Police Department





The Township of Ocean Police Department was formed in 1929 with ten officers and 95 years later has grown to sixty three officers. The members of the Police Department serve the residents and businesses with pride, respect and professionalism.

The Department takes a proactive approach to all areas of policing to provide the best possible service to the community. Criminal investigations, traffic enforcement and community policing are the three main components of that approach. Members of the Department participate in numerous community events throughout the year and pride themselves on providing excellent customer service. The Department operates a 9-1-1 Communications Center which answers over 60,000 phone calls per year and dispatches over 30,000 calls for service which are handled by police officers.



The Police Explorer Program has recently welcomed several new members and is always looking for young teenage volunteers. The explorers assist with community events and interact with police officers who volunteer as Explorer advisors. Together they are building the future in law enforcement.

The Police Department utilizes several social media platforms to send and receive information to and from the residents and public. The Code Red Community Notification System is used to notify residents of important information via phone and text. 



Office of Emergency Management





September is National Preparedness Month. The Office of Emergency Management reminds residents that "Disasters Don't Wait. Make Your Plan Today!" It is vital that all residents are prepared in the event of an emergency. Make sure you have an emergency kit and plan. Well-stocked emergency kits will allow individuals and families to survive several days without access to food, water, or electricity. Make plans with family and friends in the event you are not together when any type of emergency occurs. Discuss how you will contact each other as well as where you will meet. Discuss what you will do in different situations as well as make sure you have important documents assembled in the event that you need to evacuate. For more information on how to put a family emergency plan and kit together as well as other information, go to the NJ Office of Emergency Management Webpage at ready.nj.gov as well as ready.gov which is sponsored by the US Department of Homeland Security.

Access to reliable information is crucial in an emergency. Superstorm Sandy and other events have shown us, the time to share important information regarding disabilities and other special conditions is NOW and not when the emergency is upon us. We encourage all residents with special needs to register for Register Ready available at registerready.nj.gov. In addition, all residents to should register for NIXLE and/or Code Red so

that you can be advised of important information from the township

emergency services, schools, Department of Public Works, and others. To register for these services, go to oceantwp.org/police.

In addition, OEM will share important information on our Facebook page, NextDoor page, X (formerly Twitter) and our redesigned website at <u>oceantwp.org</u>. The Office of Emergency Management works closely with all the Township agencies.

The Township has recently reactivated our Community Emergency Response Team on CERT. For more information go to the Township website under Office of Emergency Management > CERT Registration.

In regards to Fire and EMS, our EMS services in the township are provided by paid EMS personnel provided by the fire districts. Each of our Fire Departments, Oakhurst and Wanamassa, are both VOLUNTEER departments and always looking for more members. Winter Weather Delays

For updated weather related alerts, register for Code Red and Nixle on the Township website

Garbage and Recycling Collection may be affected during inclement weather.

Snow, ice and wind can affect solid waste collection. Snow and ice make otherwise "flat" roads and lanes difficult for trucks to navigate safely, while hills can be nearly impossible to service without the risk of property damage. Wind can also be treacherous, creating roadblocks or hazards involving overhead power lines.

During serious weather events the Township will err on the side of caution and temporarily postpone collection service until conditions improve.

In the event of inclement weather, here's what to do:

- Throughout winter, please keep your sidewalk and driveway shoveled and ensure your trash and recycling containers are not hidden by snow banks or other obstructions.
- For garbage or recycling service alerts, please visit <u>www.oceantwp.org</u> or listen to local radio stations for announcements. The Township may also issue advisories via social media and other emergency notification platforms.
- 3. Please be patient. Servicing your home is a priority, but the safety of people and property always comes first.

Snow Plowing Tips and Facts

Some tips and facts to help you better understand the snow removal process:

When does plowing start? Snow plows typically start the plowing process after 3 to 4 inches of snow has fallen on the main roads.

How to shovel a driveway apron: Pile the majority of the snow to the left of your driveway when looking at your house. When the snow plows come by, there will be less snow to be plowed in front of your driveway.


Blocked driveways and mailboxes: The Township does NOT plow out driveways or dig out mailboxes.

How does salt work? Salt is usually applied prior to plowing to help make snow removal more efficient. After the salt is applied, cars work the salt into the snow to help make the salt do its job. Slush created by the salt and traffic can then be pushed off of the roadways. Once solid ice mats are formed it is difficult to remove them with the plow blade. Salt is also applied after plowing to improve driving conditions.

Keep Our Waters Clean

"Only Rain in the Drain"

Storm water runoff is one of the leading causes of water pollution in North America.

Unlike water that goes down your household drain to the sanitary sewer, water that flows into storm drains is typically not treated or filtered. Everything that goes into a storm drain flows into local creeks, lakes and the ocean.

Runoff can include soapy water from washing your car, fertilizers and pesticides, pet waste, gasoline and oil washed off your driveway, garbage and construction materials.

These substances can harm fish and other aquatic life and can reduce the quality of our drinking water. Litter, yard waste and other debris can accumulate on the drain itself and contribute to flooding and odors in your community.

Do your part:

- If you have a storm drain near your property take the time to make sure it is free of trash and debris, including leaves and grass.
- Avoid the use of soaps, fertilizers or chemicals around your property.
- Empty waste water down a sink.
- If you change your car's oil, dispose of it properly. Never dump gas, oil or paint into a storm drain.
- Sweep your driveway instead of hosing it.
- Dispose of waste properly.

More Solutions to Water Pollution

Do Not Litter

It is the responsibility of all homeowners and business owners to maintain their properties free of litter. Place all litter in proper receptacles. (Township of Ocean Revised General Ordinance 3-6.6)

Do Not Feed Wildlife

Do not feed wildlife such as ducks, geese and deer, in public areas. (Township of Ocean Revised General Ordinance 16-3.3)

Clean up after your Pet


All pet owners are required to immediately clean up and properly dispose of pet waste. Use paper bags or other devices to pick up waste. Double bag, secure it and place it into your household garbage cart. Never discard pet waste in a storm drain. (Township of Ocean Revised General Ordinance)


