Public Works News and Updates

KNOW YOUR ZONES: For purposes of trash, recycling, bulk collection, loose brush and leaf pick-up, the Township is divided into four quadrants or zones.

LOOSE BRUSH pick-up will be suspended from December 1 through March 31. During that time, place small amounts of brush in your green garbage container or place larger amounts in 45-gallon containers (or tied & bundled) curbside with your bulk collection.

OUR RECYCLING CENTER, 3603 Sunset Avenue, is open Monday through Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. and Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. Visit www.oceantwp.org/ recyclingcenter for details.

REMINDER: PLASTIC BAGS ARE NOT RECYCLABLE. Plastic bags used to hold shredded paper should be included with your regular household garbage. All recycled items must be loose inside the blue recycling carts. Permitted recyclable items include glass (bottles & jar), aluminum (cans), tin (cans), plastic (milk containers, plastic soda bottles, juice, water bottles, bleach, laundry detergent and such), newspapers, mixed papers (magazines, mail, office paper, school paper), cardboard and pizza boxes.

STORM DRAINS: With Fall upon us, Public Works would like to remind our residents, to help us keep leaves and other objects off the roadway and out of the storm drains. This will help prevent them from decomposing in our beautiful lakes and streams.

OEM Message

September is National Preparedness Month. Though we have had a rather quiet, though hot, Summer, it's not time to let your guard down as we are just hitting the peak of hurricane season and accordingly a few storms are brewing in the Atlantic. After that of course comes winter. We have been rather lucky the last few years with snow, but that could change. It is important that you are ready and have an emergency kit. For more information on building your kit, go to **ready.gov/kit**.

As a reminder, residents should want to be informed when the Township wants to get important messages to you. Ocean provides two great tools to do this. The first is **NIXLE**. NIXLE is a service that the provides email and/or text messages to keep you up-to-date with relevant community information from the Police, DPW, OEM, and other Township departments. Another vehicle is **Code RED**. This system, sometimes referred as reverse-911, will notify you by phone of important information. To sign up for these important services, click on the **NIXLE** or **Code Red** buttons on the Police Department webpage at **www. oceantwp,org/police**. Both of these services are provided FREE OF CHARGE, so please sign up for one or both to be informed.

For disabled residents of the Township, we ask that you create an account on **NJ Register Ready** - New Jersey's Special Needs Registry for Disasters. This system is designed so that residents with disabilities or access and functional needs or their caregivers can provide information that may be critical for first responders in time of disaster or emergency. To sign up, go to **register ready**. **nj.gov**. We also ask that you sign up for the **Monmouth County Special Needs Registry**. The important information you provide will be available to first responders immediately when a call for service from your home is received. This service can be access at **mcsnrnj.org**. Both of these services are available for FREE.

OEM is still looking to restart our Citizens Emergency Response Team (CERT). CERT is a program to teach you to be able to help yourself and your neighbors in an emergency. Being a member of a CERT team does not take a lot of time, but you do have to be trained. We would like to start a training class in the Fall which consists of an on-line portion as well as a hands-on practical session. Once trained, we will meet and drill a few times during the year. If interested or you have more questions, please send email to <u>cert-recruit@oceantwp.org</u>.

And of course, if you happen to see a 1st responder around town, please take a moment to say "Thank You". You don't know how far those two simple words will go to brighten their day. Remember, some work and some volunteer to help keep YOU safe.

Vehicle theft rates in the State of NJ are extremely high right now. Make sure that vehicle windows are rolled up completely when your vehicle is parked and that the doors are locked at all times while your vehicle is unoccupied. Do not leave valuables in view and do not leave key fobs inside your vehicle. Car thieves operate during all hours of the day and night so protect your property at all times. Don't make it easy for the criminals to take a joy ride in your car!

Schools in Ocean Township are back in session, therefore there are many buses on the roads and younger pedestrians traveling to and from school. Please take extra care when traveling on the roadways and be patient while the children from our community are boarding the buses. The Township buses are equipped with cameras so please DO NOT pass a bus while the flashing lights are on.

During the upcoming months, as we enter the fall and into the winter our area is known to experience all different weather events. The Police department communicates weather related emergencies and outages via several different media outlets. You can follow OTPD on Instagram, Facebook, Nixle and Twitter.
