# **Public Works News and Updates**

**ZONES:** For purposes of trash, recycling, bulk collection, loose brush and leaf pick-up, the Township is divided into four quadrants or zones.

Permitted recyclable items include glass (bottles & jar), aluminum (cans), tin (cans), plastic (milk containers, plastic soda bottles, juice, water bottles, bleach, laundry detergent and such), newspapers, mixed papers (magazines, mail, office paper, school paper) & cardboard.

The Township of Ocean is dedicated to protecting and improving the health and well-being of its residents. To help achieve these goals, the Department of Human Services provides fitness, recreation and social programs for children, adults and seniors, as well as transportation and Meals on Wheels for our oldest residents. That dedication to our residents' health and well being also includes their mental health.

For more than 30 years, the Township has provided professional, confidential, counseling services free to residents. Our team

of highly trained mental health specialists can address areas of concern such as anxiety and depression, socialization issues, use and abuse, parenting concerns and marriage, family and relationship issues.

Whether you meet with a counselor in our office at 601 Deal Road or virtually on your phone or computer, our counselors can help clients work through issues and find solutions that can bring about positive change.

Our residents' health and well being is the top priority. Prior to reopening our office to the public, we provided telehealth services so that clients could meet with counselors virtually from the safety of their own homes.

In recent months, department staff has arranged offices within the building to allow for social distancing and developed a protocol to allow in-person counseling to resume for those who prefer to meet in the office

We continue to offer telehealth counseling services for those who choose it. Virtual counseling allowed us to not only continue services during the height of the pandemic but also affords a creative option when working with families. For instance, a counselor working with an adolescent can virtually bring a parent into a session who otherwise could not make it due to childcare.

## Message from the Office of Emergency Management

To say that 2020 has been a challenge would be a gross understatement. The pandemic, a couple of tropical storms as well as some other events, have certainly stressed the emergency services of our community. I am happy to report that our 1st responders answered the bell and performed with the utmost of professionalism, and we should be proud and thankful for their dedication to our community.

We in the Office of Emergency Management want to keep the public informed of important events such as an upcoming weather event, road closings, etc. The best way for residents to receive this information is by signing up for NIXLE. NIXLE is a service that the Township provides where text messages and/or email keep you up-to-date with relevant community information from OEM, Police, DPW, and other Township departments. Another way to get pertinent information is from the Code RED system. Code RED, will notify you by phone of important information. To sign up for these services, click on the NIXLE or Code RED button on the Police Department webpage at <a href="https://www.oceantwp.org/police">www.oceantwp.org/police</a>. Both of these services are provided FREE OF CHARGE, so please sign up for one or both to be informed.

For disabled residents in the Township, we ask that you create an account on NJ Register Ready - New Jersey's Special Needs Registry for Disasters. This system is designed so that residents with disabilities or access and functional needs or their caregivers can provide information that may be critical for first responders in the time of disaster or other emergency. To sign up, go to registerready.nj.gov. We also ask that you sign up for the Monmouth County Special Needs Registry. The important information you provide to them is available to first responders immediately when a call for service from your home is received. This service can be accessed at mcsnrnj.org. Both of these services

are available for FREE.

One last request, if you see a 1st responder around town, take a minute to say "Thank you". You don't know how far those two simple words will go.
