And the Winner Is...William F. Larkin Golf Course

Ocean's community golf course has been well-known by locals for many years. Now, William F. Larkin Golf Course at Colonial Terrace has garnered national recognition as one of the top courses in the U.S.

The nine-hole course on Wickapecko Drive was named one of the Top 25 Short Courses in the U.S and one of the Top 20 Courses in New Jersey on the 2021 Golfers Choice list by GolfPass.

The annual list is compiled by analyzing the ratings and reviews submitted by golfers throughout the year. Of the 125 New Jersey courses reviewed in 2021, William F. Larkin Golf Course ranked #16.

In the rankings of US short courses (less than 18 holes) our local course ranked #23 in the nation.

These accolades come as no surprise to area golfers who have long enjoyed the course's 2,616 yards of golf from the longest tees for a par 35. The century-old Colonial Terrace Golf Course has been operated by the Township since 2008. It was renamed in 2016 to honor Ocean's former mayor who led the initiative to make the course a public space that would enhance the quality of life for residents of Ocean and surrounding communities. Leagues and lessons are offered throughout the season and the course is home to the First Tee of the Jersey Shore, a youth development program that's empowering the next generation of golfers.

Need a Lift? Free Transportation for Township Seniors

The Department of Human Services provides transportation for residents age 60 and older who need a ride to local medical appointments or shopping.

Seniors can get rides to area medical facilities on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 9am to 2pm.

On Tuesdays and Thursdays, our drivers bring seniors to local grocery stores, pharmacies and stores.

To qualify for this free service, residents must be at least age 60 and be able to enter and exit the minivans with minimal assistance. For residents with mobility issues, services are offered by the Monmouth County Division of Transportation (SCAT).
