into office for a new four (4) year term. Congratulations go out to our current team for garnering the support of the residents who took the time to exercise their right to vote. Unfortunately, we had an extremely low voter turnout which is disheartening when everyone over the age of 18 is given this right. If you did not vote in May, please make sure you vote this November.

As I begin to settle into the leadership role as Mayor, the Council has a bold agenda moving forward for the next 4 years. First, we are looking for ways to tackle the traffic issues that affect Ocean. I already met with New Jersey Department of Transportation to discuss the Deal Road, West Park Ave, and Highway 35 traffic. Second, we are looking very closely at the entire Highway 35 corridor. Our Township Manager will be setting up a business summit to discuss businesses while taking a hard look at Route 35 including blighted areas in need of redevelopment. Third, we committed to a deer management plan within a year, and we are way ahead of that goal. Fourth, we are looking to build a new Municipal Hall because we are out of room and our staff cannot address the needs of the residents properly. And finally, we will be addressing Planning and Zoning in a systematic way. Our terms will be about continued action for Ocean.

Ocean Township just set up a new website that is more user friendly. With the new website, we have added a link to let the manager or department heads know what needs to be addressed. The Council cannot answer complaints addressed on social media accounts as this gets us all into the weeds of the issues and adds to the response time. Fall Brush & Leave Rules

BRUSH may be placed loose at the curb line in SEPTEMBER AND OCTOBER ONLY, in accordance with brush zones collection schedule. No piece shall exceed four feet in length, in piles not to exceed three feet in height and extend more than four feet from the curb line into the roadway and shall at no time create a traffic hazard. No other debris or trash shall be mixed in with the brush. Small quantities (under 50 lbs.) shall be bundled or containerized and placed at the curb line for collection on bulk day.

LEAVES can be placed loose at the curb or along the street OCTOBER 1 THROUGH DECEMBER 10 only 10 business days PRIOR scheduled collection dates and shall not exceed five feet in width and shall not be placed closer than 10 feet to any storm drain inlet.


