Public Works News and Updates

Spring loose leaf pick-up will take place through April. Brush collection will take place through October. Zone information and pick-up dates can be found on our website and on the Township's calendar. Brush should be at the curb no more than one week prior to your scheduled pick-up. Dispose of small amounts of brush by either placing them in your green garbage container with your garbage, or by placing them curbside in 45-gallon containers (or neatly tied and bundled) with your monthly bulk collection.

No shredded paper, plastic bags, plastic film of any sort can be recycled. These items must now be included with your garbage.

RECYCLING INFORMATION

All recyclables must be loose inside the blue cart. Permitted recyclables include: glass (bottles and jars), aluminum (cans), tin (cans), Plastic (milk containers, plastic soda bottles, juice, water bottles, bleach, laundry, detergent, and such), newspaper, mixed paper (magazines, mail, office paper, school paper) and cardboard (not to exceed the height from the lid of the cart).

Our recycling drop-off center at 3603 Sunset Avenue offers extended summer hours from April 15 - September 30:

- Monday through Friday 7:30 a.m. 2:30 p.m. (extended hours until 5:30 p.m. on Tuesday and Thursday)
- Saturday and Sunday 8:00 a.m. 12:00 p.m.

Curbside metal collection dates are as follows: April 29, July 29, and September 30. No need to call for an appointment.

Place all items to the curb the night before. Metal items can also be brought to the Sunset Avenue Recycling Center.

Environmental Economics

The Environmental Commission, in partnership with Sustainable Jersey, has created the "Green Ocean Township" campaign to help homeowners and business owners lower emissions from buildings. **Residents** have hands-on assistance to help reduce energy bills, create a cleaner, healthier community, and protect our planet for future generations. Homeowners may qualify for up to \$4,000 in cash rebates and up to \$15,000 in zero-interest financing for home energy improvements that reduce energy use by 60 percent. **Business owners**, after a free energy audit, will be eligible for New Jersey's Direct Install program, which pays for 70% of upgrade costs. In addition, New Jersey Natural Gas can finance the remaining 30% of the costs at 0% interest over 3 years. Visit our website for more information.

Comment on our Draft Environmental Resource Inventory

The Environment Commission is seeking public comment on the Township's Environmental Resource Inventory (ERI)currently in draft. The ERI covers a wide array of subjects pertaining to the town's natural environment, documenting its natural resources and environmentally significant features. The ERI will neither interpret facts nor make recommendations, but will serve as an important input to the Township's Master Plan. The ERI will also accelerate our Sustainable Jersey certification. We anticipate that the ERI will be completed this September, with a public presentation made at that time. The History of Joe Palaia Park

Joe Palaia Park offers a variety of opportunities for recreation. Visitors come to the park to walk, run, picnic, cycle and enjoy the scenery. The park comprises more than 200 acres of public open space with woods, walking trails, sports fields and festival grounds and is home to an abundance of wildlife.

The tract was once known as the Deal Test Site, and through much of the 20th century was used by AT&T, Bell Laboratories and then the U.S. Army Signal Corps for research on wireless radio transmissions. During the 1950s and 60s the missiles and satellites launched from Cape Kennedy, as well as Russian satellites such as Sputnik, were monitored from Deal Test Site.

The Township acquired the property in 1973 to preserve the land for open space and the enjoyment of the community. In 1998 the park was renamed Joe Palaia Park in honor of Joseph A. Palaia, who served the people of Ocean as a teacher and principal, and later as a councilman, mayor, State Assemblyman and State Senator representing the people of Ocean and surrounding communities.

The park's three-mile paved loop trail is open year-round to walkers, runners and cyclists. You can download a trail map from our website.

And what's new: If you have used the trail recently, you probably noticed the new structures in the park. The disc golf course is the latest addition to the recreation opportunities available for park patrons. Disc golf is one of the fastest growing sports in the country. It's fun for all ages, easy to learn and free to play!

All that's required to play are a pair of comfortable shoes and a set of discs. The Recreation office has several sets of discs available to borrow. Stop by during regular office hours, show your identification, and provide your address and phone number. Discs will be loaned on a first-come, first-served basis. Discs are available for purchase at many local stores that sell sporting equipment as well as through online retailers.

To learn more about how to play, those age 14 and older can register for a two-day disc golf workshop to be held on April 8 and 13. For details and
