Police Updates



With the warmer spring and summer weather quickly approaching there will be more opportunities for burglars to strike. Make sure that vehicle windows are rolled up completely when your vehicle is parked and that the doors are locked at all times while your vehicle is unoccupied. Do not leave valuables in view and do not leave key fobs inside your vehicle. Car thefts are more prevalent during the summer months and thieves are searching for vehicles that are unlocked with the fobs inside. Don't make it easy for the criminals to take a joy ride in your car!



Over the past year there have been several scams that have been targeting elderly members of our community. The most common scams are the Family Emergency Scam, the Utility Company Scam and the Social Security Administration Scam. The majority of companies will not require you to provide your personal information over the phone nor will they ask you to provide payment in the form of any type of gift card. If you receive one of these calls, make sure to ask questions and attempt to verify who is calling. In order to verify the call, hang up and call the customer service number listed on your credit card statement or call the police department where your family member may is supposedly being held. Resist the urge to act immediately no matter how real the story sounds.

Message from the Office of Emergency Management

The Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) program helps train people to be better prepared to respond to emergency situations in their community. When emergencies occur, CERT members can provide critical support to first responders, immediate help to victims of the emergency, and also assist in the organization of volunteers who make themselves available at the disaster site. CERT is a perfect vehicle for those citizens who want to help and make a difference but cannot commit to the demands of other services like your volunteer fire department.

CERTs have been used for:

- Search of lost or kidnapped children
- Staff Emergency Operations Center and monitor events
- Manage "spontaneous/convergent" volunteers
- Assist the Red Cross and other relief organizations on mass care

All training will be provided as well as a response kit with necessary equipment.

CERT falls under the direction of the Twp of Ocean Office of Emergency Management. Deputy Coordinator Michael Evans will lead our effort. Right now we are collecting names of residents who may want to be involved. If you are interested or would like more information, please email us at cert-recruit@oceantwp.org. We look to start training in the late spring/early summer.
