### March 3 - *Mad Max Fury Road* (2015) (R)

#### 2016 Oscar Nomination for Best Picture

Return to the apocalyptic world of the Road Warrior, where humanity is broken, and almost everyone is crazed fighting for the necessities. Max (Tom Hardy) tries to survive but looks toward restoring peace. Swept up with a group fleeing across the Wasteland, headed by elite rebel Furiosa (Charlize Theron), he finds a worthy cohort. Might these two rebels on the run be able to restore order? **Action/Adventure/Sci-Fi - 120 minutes.**

### March 10 - *The Martian* (2015) (PG-13)

#### 2016 Oscar Nomination for Best Picture

During a mission to Mars, Astronaut Mark Watney (Matt Damon) is presumed dead after a fierce storm, left behind by his crew, and finds himself stranded and alone on the hostile planet with only meager supplies. As stories of incredible bravery unfold, the world comes together to root for Watney's safe return. **Adventure/Drama/Sci-Fi - 144 minutes.**

### March 17 - *Steve Jobs* (2015) (R)

#### 2016 Oscar Nomination for Best Actor in a Leading Role

This incisive biographical drama, written by Aaron Sorkin (The West Wing), explores the genius, passion, ingenuity, and shortcomings of computing guru Steve Jobs (Michael Fassbender). Go behind the scenes of the digital revolution, to see a portrait of the genius at its epicenter, whose drive to revolutionize technology some describe as sacrificial. **Biography/Drama - 122 minutes.**

### March 24 - *Bridge of Spies* (2015) (PG-13)


#### 2016 Oscar Nominations for Best Picture and Best Adapted Screenplay

In this Steven Spielberg directed piece, Cold War Brooklyn lawyer (Tom Hanks) is tasked with negotiating a prisoner exchange between a soviet spy serving a 45-year sentence for espionage and an American U-2 pilot shot down over the U.S.S.R. **Historical Drama - 135 minutes.**

### March 31 - *Brooklyn* (2015) (PG-13)

#### 2016 Oscar Nominations for Best Picture and Best Adapted Screenplay

Irish immigrant (Saoirse Ronan), lands in 1950s Brooklyn, where she quickly falls into a romance with a local. When her past catches up with her she must choose between two countries and the lives that exist within. Enjoy how Colm Toibin's book "Brooklyn", gets remolded into a wonderful screenplay by Nick Hornby. **Drama/Romance - 115 minutes.**
