
# “Greasy Luck!”

## Stories of a New England Whalerman

Featuring David Emerson, living history interpreter

Capt. Leland Emerson, master of the brigantine Sarah Ann in the year 1843, recounts the trials and toils of the hunt for Leviathan. Hear about life on board a whaling ship and of perilous adventures at sea - including encounters with the infamous great white whale, “Mocha Dick.”\*

David Emerson’s lifelong career as a living history interpreter includes Colonial Williamsburg, Plimoth Plantation, Morristown National History Park and The Old Barracks Museum, where he has played a range of characters. He also is one of the premier George Washington interpreters in New Jersey.
